

Back to School Tips

- Please dress your kiddos in comfortable clothing, including CLOSED-TOE shoes! Learning can be messy and having proper shoes keeps them safe on the playground!
- If sending a lunch or snacks with your child, please remember we are a NUT FREE school.
 Nut products (including peanut butter and Nutella) are not permitted. Additionally, please do not send items that require refrigeration or heating. Ice packs and thermoses work great in a lunch box! :)
- Please send a LABLED, refillable water bottle with your student to school each day. We often have kiddos with the same style water bottle so please label in a permanent way.
- Please label EVERYTHING you send to school. We end up with a lot of water bottles, jackets and assorted items in our lost and found each year.
- **Infants**: please label not only bottles, but their lids as well. Each individual food item should be labeled, along with pacifiers, changes of clothing, and all items sent to school. Thank you!
- "Family Work": Many of our CARES classes will offer "family work" as an extension of learning and a way for parents to keep connected with their child's progress. However, home work or "family work" at this age is always OPTIONAL and there is never a grade. While there may be a "due date" to return your child's folder, please do not let this be a source of stress for your preschool student (or you!).

Please keep your toys at home!

Please do not send toys from home unless it is for Show and Tell! We cannot guarantee that toys from home are age appropriate for the class; they often go missing; we cannot ensure they won't be broken, and they often create a distraction and/or conflict. The exception is nap-time lovey items that remain in cubbies at all times other than nap.
