


Title	Supplies Needed	Activity Steps
I Spy Art	Paper, stickers, I Spy book (if available)	Make your own "I Spy" art page. Show your child an "I Spy" book (if available) or explain how the "I Spy" game works. Place a variety of stickers on a piece of paper. Take turns playing the game.
Shapes Scavenger Hunt	Shapes Scavenger Hunt activity page, crayon	Print the Shapes Scavenger Hunt activity page. Have your child look inside and outside for items that match each shape, then mark and X over each shape they find. Supervise children while outside.
Master Meltdown	Your choice of items to freeze, bowl, water, spray bottle	Make a frozen mystery by placing a variety of items in a bowl of water and freezing it. Place the frozen block in a tub or place on a table outside. Have your child guess what is inside. Give your child a spray bottle with water to squirt at the mysterious frozen block. As the spray hits the ice, the water will begin to melt, revealing the treasures inside. You can freeze multiple blocks. **Make sure items are not choking hazards.
Detective Disguise Dress Up	Disguise clothing (old Halloween costumes, scarves, gloves, jackets, sunglasses, hats, blankets, etc.)	Talk about how detectives must wear disguises: A disguise gives someone a different appearance in order to conceal their identity. Sometimes detectives wear a disguise so that they can find more information about a mystery. You and your child can dress in disguise! Disguises can be anything including old Halloween costumes. Have fun with this activity. When the child walks in the room, address them per the disguise they are wearing. If you do not have a costume, use scarves, gloves, jackets, sunglasses, hats, blankets, etc. Post a picture of your child in disguise on your Childrens Lighthouse school's Facebook page.
Community Watch	2 toilet paper roll cardboard inserts, single hole punch, glue, yarn or string	Supervising adult: Glue the sides of the toilet paper rolls together, let dry, then punch a hole in each side of the binoculars. Tie the ribbon/yarn through the holes. Go outside and sit with your child where you can see things in the community (front yard or backyard). Tell your child to use the "binoculars" look for items in the community (trees, people, cars, birds, airplanes, houses, pets, etc.).




