MONTESSORI INDEPENDENCE

Creating a Montessori-inspired environment enhances children's independence and focus through key strategies:

- **Child-Sized Environment:** Use accessible furniture for easy material access.
- **Real Materials:** Provide safe kitchen tools and natural toys for sensory experiences.
- **Involving Children in Routines:** Encourage participation in tasks to build responsibility.
- **Freedom Within Limits:** Set guidelines while allowing choices for autonomy.
- **Respecting Natural Pace:** Let children work at their own speed to foster creativity.

Activity at Home: Set up a "dressing station" with reachable clothes and labeled storage to encourage self-dressing and decision-making. These strategies promote growth, independence, and a love for learning.
