


March 2019

Our friends used their fine motor skills to do some heart stamping using red paint and heart shaped cookie cutters and applied it onto their paper. We incorporated our color of the month, red, as well as our shape for the month, the heart. We had lots of fun seeing how unique their masterpieces turned out as they freely expressed themselves.

The toddlers also used their fine motor skills to make fluffy clouds. As they glued cotton balls onto blue paper for a nice sky background, they got to enjoy a nice sensory experience as we discussed how soft the real clouds must be.

February has been a very busy month for our toddlers as we explored so many ways to express our sky theme through painting, coloring, projects, etc. We also had the chance to get messy when we used our sensory bin to explore shaving cream with food coloring to create our own clouds and rainbows in the sky.
