#### **Appropriate Footwear**

Please ensure they wear safe shoes to school.

This type of footwear provides protection against potential injuries, especially during physical activities and playtime. Closed-toe shoes, with a back, and traction help prevent accidents allowing your child to participate fully and safely in all school activities.

#### **Appropriate Change of Clothes**

#### No Toys or Food from Home

By leaving these items at home, we can maintain a focused and organized learning environment for everyone.

  - At Children's Lighthouse, we emphasize Evidence of Learning. This includes tangible proof, such as projects and worksheets, that clearly show what your child has learned.
