The **Dramatic play center** is a place students can go to pretend, imagine, and be creative. Students can pretend to be anyone and do anything! This is powerful for our little learners. It is a place that promotes high-level thinking, problem solving, turn taking, and is rich place for teaching vocabulary. Children learn by using:

- Dress up Clothing
- Items from home such as kitchen set
- puppets
- Props to encourage exploration
- Small group of classmates to socialize with and problem solve

How Teachers Use The Dramatic Paly Center
