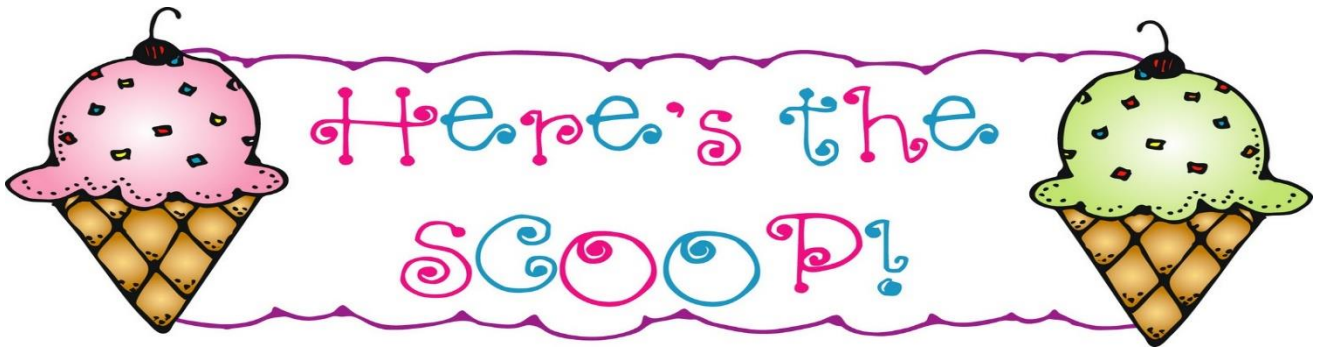

Children and Digital Media: Tips from the American Academy of Pediatrics

- **Treat media as you would any other environment in your child's life.** The same parenting guidelines apply in both real and virtual environments. Set limits—children need and expect them.
- **Make unplugged playtime a priority.** Unstructured and offline playtime stimulates brain development and curiosity.
- **Share media experiences with your child.** Shared experiences support social interactions, bonding, and learning. Create “tech-free” zones. Keep family mealtimes tech-free and re-charge devices outside of the child's bedrooms.
- **Don't use technology as an emotional pacifier.** While the use of media can be one way to keep children quiet, it shouldn't be the only way they learn to calm down or alleviate boredom. Use the monthly Lighthouse C.A.R.E.S.S.M Character Connections to teach your child other ways to identify and handle strong emotions.
- **Choose Apps Wisely.** More than 80,000 apps are labeled “educational,” yet the majority have little or no research to support that claim. Look to organizations such as Common Sense Media (www.common.sense.media.org) for recommendations and reviews of quality, age-appropriate apps.
- **Expand the use of portable devices beyond “games.”** Read e-books together; encourage creativity with drawing and painting apps; take photos on a nature walk; and visit webcam sites such as the ones sponsored by the San Diego Zoo and the Smithsonian.

Family Friendly Summer Activities

- **Sienna Library** – Your local library has daily story times for children, family programs on Saturdays, and all the books you and your little one can enjoy!
- **HMNS Sugar Land** – This Natural History Museum, located down the road in Sugar Land, has fun, interactive exhibits for you and your family including a Digital Dome Theatre and a Dinosaur Dig-Pit.
- **Discovery Green** – Located in Houston, this park has so much to offer! From Toddler Tuesdays, to classic stories and plays, to STEM workshops on Saturdays for the older kids, you and your family will enjoy spending time together here.
