Solo Challenge: TURKEY IN A CUP

Have you ever witnessed lightning during a storm? Sometimes it's distant, and other times it's close and dazzling! Lightning is essentially electricity in action. In this Challenge, we're going to simulate lightning using static electricity. You might have experienced static electricity yourself, like when your hair stands on end after rubbing a balloon against it.

Follow the steps for Testing Sound Waves:

- 1. Lay out the trash bag flat on the table and secure it in place with tape.
- 2. Place the metal pan on top of the trash bag.
- 3. Roll the clay into a ball.
- 4. Firmly push the clay ball to the center of the pan to make a handle.

Experiment

- 1. Hold onto the clay handle and push your pan in circles for about 30 seconds. For this experiment to work, you cannot touch the metal of the pan.
- 2. Pick up your pan, touching only the clay handle. 3. Keep the pan lifted with one hand while using the other hand to touch the metal lid to one corner of the pan. Watch closely. You see a tiny spark jump from the corner of the pan to the lid
