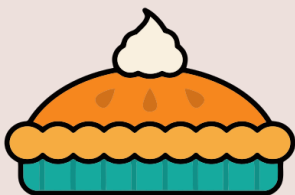

We are collecting items for the Round Rock Food Pantry!

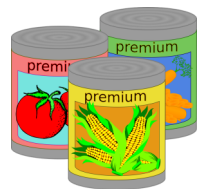
We will start taking donations November 1st

ABSENTEE CREDITS

With the holidays coming up and vacation plans, we wanted to explain how charges work and how absentee credits are applied.

How we bill: All accounts are charged on Monday for your agreed upon tuition regardless of your child's specific attendance for the week. Each contract indicates that the account holder is responsible for payment. Payments are due by Tuesday of each week.

Absentee Credit:

Each child who attends FULL TIME *(RESTRICITONS APPLY)* receives 5 Absentee Credits a year.

Credits are applied when your child is out 3 or more days within the week consecutively and our closure dates do not apply to those 3 days. For Example, we will be closed Christmas eve and Christmas day. Those days do not count towards your 3 consecutive days of absences.

How it works:

Account holder fills out an absentee form and submits before the dates of the absences

Account holder must pay for the absentee week at 60% ahead of time

Account is billed for full amount of tuition

Account is given a 40% deduction

****RESTRICTIONS:**

Children ages 6 weeks to 12 months do not receive this credit

Part time children do not receive this credit

School-Age children do not receive this credit

School – Age program (Anchors classroom)

School- Age children are billed \$120.00 for after school care. Account holder is billed whether the child attends for the week or not. You are paying to hold you spot at a contractual rate instead of \$75/day drop-in rate.

School-Age children who have 1-2 single days out of school are billed their normal tuition charges (\$120.00) plus \$35.00 a day for each full day of care.

If the elementary is closed 3 or more days within the week, this is considered Holiday Camp. Tuition for Holiday Camp is \$250.00 for the week. There are no additional charges.

We hope this explanation helps you navigate our billing. We wish everyone Happy Holidays!
