

Outside Playtime

We are required to offer students in Rooms 3-10 two 30 minute "Recesses" to explore outdoors. Certain weather conditions may prohibit this, including precipitation, wind chill of 35 degrees or lower, or in the event of a heat advisory. In these instances, we will provide an active indoor activity instead. Please dress your child accordingly for the weather and note that we cannot restrict your child's outside playtime without a doctor's note stating a medical reason. We always take a conservative approach to determine if weather is appropriate (i.e., not raining but radar indicates it is imminent). Thank you for your support!

Managing Illness in our School



Kids get sick. How can we best handle it? Having a sick kiddo is not fun. It can mean missing work and interrupting your routine, not to mention it just stinks for your kiddo to not feel well. At Children's Lighthouse, we abide by some very strict guidelines when it comes to illness, most of which are provided to us by our licensing entity. By clearly sharing these protocols and working together, we hope to mitigate the spread of illness as much as possible. We can't keep every germ out of school, but we can work together to prevent them spreading. **Thank you for your support!**



What is considered a fever?

We consider anything 100 degrees or above to be a fever. There is no evidence to support that teething causes a significant fever above 100.

When can my child return to school?

If your child has a fever or is sent home with a fever of 100 or above, he or she *may not return to school the next day* unless cleared by his or her pediatrician to do so. He or she may only return when he/she has been fever– free *without the use of fever-reducing medication, for at least 24 hours.*

ILLNESS REPORTS If your child is diagnosed with a communicable disease, including: Strep, Flu, COVID, Hand Foot and Mouth, or RSV, please alert the school via phone or email. When a communicable disease is reported, we will inform parents of that classroom so they can be on alert for possible symptoms. Many illnesses are contagious before symptoms even appear so this will help us all be on alert.

Childcare regulations REQUIRE us to send your child home in the following situations:

- A fever of 100 or above
- Diarrhea (3+ bouts of diarrhea at school will require us to send a child home)
- Vomiting (2+ vomiting episodes at school will require us to send a child home)
- Discharge from eyes with redness
- Unexplained rash or blisters
- Dry, persistent cough

If sent home with any of the above symptoms, child remain home the next day and until symptom -free for at least 24 hours *without the use of fever- or symptom-reducing medication.*

*Per our governing authority, we are not permitted to admit any child to class with the above symptoms. A doctor's note provided directly to us stating that your child is in good health *and not actively contagious* with such symptoms may be accepted for returning to school. Thank you for your support!
